The Department of State is committed to addressing concerns of potential impacts to communities and livelihoods that share water resources such as the Kootenai River watershed.

The Department has spearheaded action on this important issue. Our Canadian Affairs Director Cynthia Kierscht led an interagency delegation to the October semi-annual meetings of the International Joint Commission (IJC) in Ottawa. She raised the issue with Sylvain Fabi, Executive Director of the Division of U.S. Transboundary Affairs of Global Affairs Canada. Ms. Kierscht highlighted U.S. concerns regarding transboundary mining impacts on the United States and secured a commitment from Global Affairs Canada to engage in a bilateral review of gaps and limitations in current efforts on this issue. The Department will lead this review process with interagency, tribal, and stakeholder input. We expect to share findings from our bilateral review with Global Affairs Canada at the April 2018 IJC meetings. We welcome your input as we move forward.

To strengthen our engagement, the Department established an interagency workgroup co-chaired with the EPA to coordinate our actions and communicate our concerns to the Canadian government. 
