

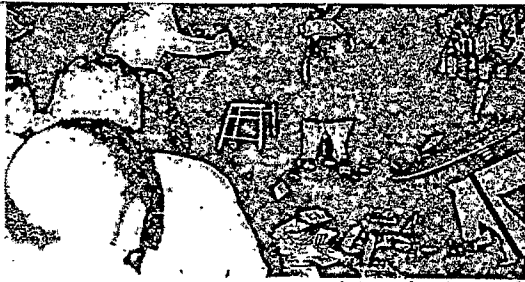
I, Joey Kositzky, declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct:

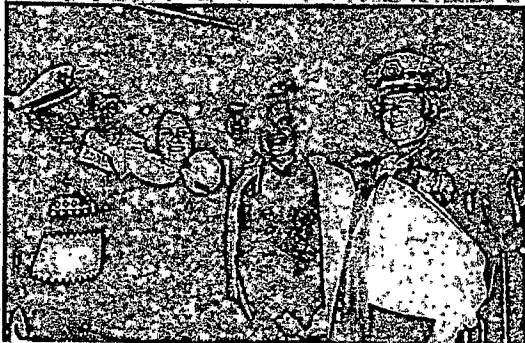
